The Humble Petition of **Eliza Hunter**

Sheweth

That Petitioner was tried at Green St<sup>t</sup> Dublin on Nov<sup>r</sup> 9<sup>th</sup> 1844 by the Recorder for stealing a pair of Boots & sentenced to seven years transportation, but having a daughter married & settled in America who would gladly receive her, should mercy be extended & Petitioner's sentence commuted to any time imprisonment your Excellency seems fit and your Petitioner as in duty bound will ever pray.
