To the R^t Hon^{ble} the Earl De Grey, Lord Lieut General and General Governor of Ireland

The Humble Petition of Anne Larney

Sheweth

That your Petitioner was sentenced on the 21st of April 1841. To 7 years Transportation at Shiremore Sessions King's Co by I^r Nelson Esqr. Asst Barrister for Stealing Potatoes

That your Petitioner does not attempt to deny her guilt but pleads in extenuation extreme want and utter destitution with her children crying around her for food. Petitioner is the wife of a Soldier who was at the time and still is in the Isle of France with his Regiment , a few days after she committed the theft she received a remittance from him of 5 pounds had it pleased the Almighty to have reached her a few days sooner the crime and suffering would have been prevented.

But should your Excellency mercifully listen to her prayer it shall ever be a lesson to her in future and your Petitioner as in duty bound will ever pray.
